**NEW BUSINESS:**

**APPROVAL OF CONTRACT FOR DAM SAFETY INSPECTIONS**

**APPROVED**

The two dams, at 21st Street and Plum Road, were completed three years ago. Due to them being high hazard dams, they are to be inspected every three years. Proposals were solicited, with the City receiving them from Benesch, Campbell & Johnson, and RMA Engineering. Staff recommended RMA as the low proposal.

Commissioner Lambertz moved to approve the city manager to sign the contract with RMA Engineers for the dam safety inspections in an amount not to exceed \$6,000.00. Commissioner Matthew seconded. Motion carried.

**MANAGER'S REPORT**

City Manager Lange said the replacement of the server is now underway. Tomorrow there will be a joint legislative tax force meeting with KDOT, and several will be attending. Fall Fest is coming up, with the City providing two events; the fire truck pull and vehicle smash.

**MAYOR/COMMISSIONER COMMENTS AND REPORTS**

Commissioner Matthew said he receives questions about the Plaza's success. City Manager Lange encouraged sending those questions to CloudCorp, which manages the Plaza.

Commissioner Hasch commended local law enforcement for their attention to the citizens, and Mayor Sacco agreed.

**STAFF COMMENTS**


Amber Farha provided explanation of revenues and expenses for the recent pool season. It was considered a success with the new slide.
