

Community Service Opportunities

It is your responsibility to locate and arrange where you do your community service. It is also your responsibility to record your time worked, have your supervisor sign off on your hours worked and have your arrangement approved by the court. You must turn in your completed community service forms by the time stipulated by the court. It is also your responsibility to contact the Municipal Court or the City Prosecutor if you have questions about your community service obligation.

You will not be given credit for “community service” for work done for individuals, even if you are not being paid. Additionally, you cannot be paid for any work that you are doing for community service.

All community service must be done in Cloud County. If you have special circumstances, and would like to arrange for your community service to be completed outside of Cloud County, you must have it approved by the City Prosecutor.
